

HEADLEY FLOWER SHOW 2013 SCHEDULE and ENTRY FORMS



Headley Flower Show will be held on Saturday 21st September at 2.00 pm in the Village Hall

All Headley and Boxhill residents are warmly invited to enter this annual competition, as are non-residents who actively participate in Headley Village activities and non-resident grandchildren are also welcome to enter all classes. Whatever your age or level of skill, you will probably find your craft or gardening hobby here. All entries are welcome - do not let the thought of impossibly high judging standards put you off; rather than criticise, our judges aim to encourage and praise!

An entry fee of 20p per adult per exhibit is payable with the entry form. All children's entries are FREE. All exhibits (except photography) are to be set up and displayed between

8.00am and 10.15am on the day of the show. Judging will commence at 10.30 am.

Doors will be open to the public from 2.00pm. The prize giving ceremony will be at 3.00pm, after which there will be a sale of donated exhibits.

Categories

HORTICULTURAL CATEGORY

CLASSES:

1. Rose large flowered - 1 bloom.
2. Rose large flowered - 3 blooms, one or more cultivars, one vase.
3. Rose cluster flowered - 1 stem
4. A bowl of roses - judged for effect.
5. Pot grown flowering plant (see **Show Regulations 9**).
6. Pot grown foliage plant (see **Show Regulations 9**).
7. Exotic pot plant (Orchid etc.) (see **Show Regulations 9**).
8. A planted Succulent/Cactus. (see **Show Regulations 9**).
9. Annuals mixed one vase (see **Show Notes General**).
10. Cut flowers arranged for effect, one vase.
11. Stem cut single chrysanthemums, one variety – 3 large blooms.
12. Stem cut spray chrysanthemums, one variety – 3 sprays.
13. Stem cut single Dahlias, one variety – 3 blooms.
14. Perennials mixed, one vase.
15. A jug of herbs.
16. Perennials one kind, one vase (excluding flowers for which classes are provided)
17. Planted container - not to exceed 31cm/12" square, or diameter.
18. A hanging basket.
19. Apples, Dessert, 4 in number
20. Apples, Culinary, 4 in number.
21. Pears, 4 in number.
22. Stone fruit, one kind, 6 in number.
23. Any other fruit, 6 in number.
24. Cabbage, any variety, 1 in number.
25. French beans, 6 in number.
26. Runner beans, 6 in number.
27. Leeks, 3 in number.
28. Onions, 3 in number.
29. Tomatoes, 6 in number.
30. Cherry tomatoes, 1 truss.
31. Globe beetroot, 3 in number.
32. Carrots, 6 in number.
33. Potatoes, one cultivar, one plate of 6.
34. Any other vegetable, one kind, one cultivar, 3 in number (Cauliflowers 2).
35. Courgettes, 3 in number.
36. An arrangement of vegetables and/or fruit grown by the exhibitor displayed in a space not to exceed 45cm/18" square.
37. Heaviest pumpkin.
38. Longest marrow.

DECORATIVE CATEGORY

(Flowers in this section need not be grown by the exhibitor.)

39. "The Last night of the Proms"
Space allowed 76cm wide, 61cm deep, 91cm high / 2'6" w, 2' d, 3' h.
40. "Autumn" an arrangement using autumnal colours.
Space allowed 30cm wide x 30cm deep, high / 1' w, 1' d, 1' h.
41. A miniature arrangement in a pillbox.
Maximum total size 10cm wide, 10cm deep, 10cm high / 4" w, 4" d, 4" h.



CHILDREN'S CATEGORY (Please state exhibitor's age on entry form)

Open to those 14 years and under. Classes will be judged for two age ranges: 8 YEARS AND UNDER, and 9 TO 14 YEARS OLD

- 42. Two decorated gingerbread men.
- 43. A person made out of fruit & vegetables.
- 44. Best dressed wellie boot.
- 45. A treasure map, any medium.
- 46. A computer design for a book cover.
- 47. A display of seed heads.

DOMESTIC CATEGORY

- 48. Bread, one seeded loaf, made in a machine (see **Show Notes**).
- 49. 6 Handmade white bread rolls. (see **Show Notes**).
- 50. A jar of fruit jelly, not less than 225g/0.5lb (see **Show Notes**).
- 51. A jar of chutney, not less than 225g/0.5lb (see **Show Notes**).

- 52. 4 cheese straws.
- 53. A lemon tart not to exceed 25cm/10".
- 54. 4 decorated cup cakes.
- 55. A light fruit cake. Recipe:

Ingredients

- 1kg mixed dried fruits
- 150ml brandy
- zest and juice 2 oranges
- 250g unsalted butter, softened, extra for tin
- 250g light, soft brown sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 4 eggs
- 200g plain flour
- 2 tsp mixed spice
- 100g whole or flaked almonds

Method:

Put dried fruit mixture into a large bowl with brandy, citrus zest & juice. Mix well, cover & leave overnight.

1. Heat oven to 160C/140C fan/gas 3. Butter and double-line a deep cake tin - 20cm round - with baking parchment to come 2.5cm above the top of the tin. Wrap the outside of the tin with a few sheets of newspaper/brown paper, securing with staples or string.
2. Beat the butter, sugar and vanilla until creamy, then beat in the eggs one by one. Tip in the flour, mixed spice, soaked dried fruit, and liquid from the bowl, plus the nuts. Stir, then scrape into cake tin. Using the back of your spoon, make a slight dent in the centre of the mixture; bake for 1½ hrs.
3. Reduce oven to 140C/120C fan/gas 1, loosely cover the top of the cake with a double sheet of foil or baking parchment, and bake for another 45 mins-1 hr or until a skewer poked right to the bottom comes out clean. Cool in the tin, then lift out and wrap in greaseproof paper or baking parchment.

HANDICRAFT CATEGORY

All work to have been completed in the last 2 years. Models made from kits or parts not eligible.

- 56. A knitted item.
- 57. Write 1 or 2 verses of rhyming poetry, each verse of 4 or 5 lines on the subject *Flowers in Summer Time* to include any two of the following words: *Headley, season, peace, weed, soil*, including plurals.
- 58. Handmade object other than in classes.
- 59. A hand or machine sewn garment.

PHOTOGRAPHIC CATEGORY

Film & Digital - Open to Adults and 16 Years and Under

All prints to be not less than 5"x3"/12.5cmx7.5cm and no larger than 7"x5"/17.5cmx12.5cm, colour or monochrome, matt or glossy. **Important:** Before submitting your entry, read **Show Notes - Photography**.

- 61. Surrey Heritage.
- 62. A close up macro photograph.
- 63. Gardener's World.
- 64. Wildlife.
- 65. Any subject - judged on merit (print not to have been exhibited previously).
- 66. A digitally altered face, human or animal.
- 67. Any subject - judged on merit using digital manipulation.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. Entry forms must be completed with the numbers for classes (1-61) which it is intended to enter, signed by the exhibitor, and returned to the Show Secretary **at least 3 days before the show (18th July)**. An entry fee of 20p per exhibit must accompany the entry form.
2. No exhibitor may make more than one entry in any one class - other than the Photography category.
3. All horticultural exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor in his/her garden or allotment for a period of not less than two months prior to the show.
4. Exhibits must be staged during the times stipulated on the schedule. Late staging may preclude entry of exhibits.
5. Class cards will be supplied for each exhibit and exhibitors are responsible for placing these face downwards by the exhibit to which they refer. Cards will be reversed after judging has been completed. Please see separate instructions regarding Photography category.
6. After judging has taken place, no exhibit or part thereof may be altered or removed until the conclusion of the show.
7. Horticultural classes will be judged by the rules of the Royal Horticultural Society.
8. Only authorised persons are allowed to be present during judging.
9. All pot plants to have been grown by the exhibitor for at least 6 months prior to show.
10. Points will be awarded as follows:-
1st = 3 points; 2nd = 2 points;
3rd (if applicable) = 1 point.

SHOW NOTES

General

In the schedule the words 'kinds' and 'varieties' are used in the following sense:

- Roses and dahlias are different kinds of flowers. In the case of roses - 'PEACE' and 'MARGARET' are different cultivars.
- Annual is defined as a plant which grows from seed, and which naturally and ordinarily flowers, seeds and dies within 12 months.
- Perennial is defined as a plant, which lives for years, the stem and leaves die down in winter and new shoots re-appear each spring.

Horticultural

Flowers should be fresh and free from damage due to weather, pests, disease and faulty handling. Vegetables should be clean, fresh, tender, and free from blemishes and should be properly prepared for the exhibition. Roots should be washed clean.

Vases and plates should be simple and provided by the exhibitor.

Flowers should be exhibited in containers with water or water retaining material.

Domestic

Plain bottles (unbranded) and jars and/or lids must be used.

Jars of marmalade, jelly, jam or chutney must be filled to the top while hot. No wax discs.

Chutney must be at least 3 months old and jar must have a metal top with a wax disk or a plastic top, no kilner jars.

Entries must be labelled with name of contents, day, month, and year of making.

Cakes cannot be judged if still warm. Bread should be baked 24 hours prior to judging.

Handicraft

All articles should be fresh, clean and unworn.

Photography

Please enter name, address, and age (if under 16) on the back of photograph. No photograph to have been taken more than 3 years ago. There is a limit of 3 photographs per participant in any category. 16 years and under may participate in any category with no entry fee, and will be judged separately.

All prints must be clearly marked on the back with your name, address, plus the class number and category that you have entered it into.

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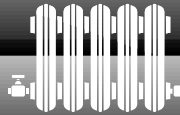
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
